<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• like to push and pull objects</li> <li>• say at least 6 words</li> <li>• follow simple directions ("Bring the ball")</li> <li>• pull off shoes, socks and mittens</li> <li>• can point to a picture that you name in a book</li> <li>• feed themselves</li> <li>• make marks on paper with crayons</li> <li>• walk without help</li> <li>• walk backwards</li> <li>• point, make sounds or try to use words to ask for things</li> <li>• say "no," shake their head or push away things they don't want</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• use two-to-three-word sentences</li> <li>• say about 50 words</li> <li>• recognize familiar pictures</li> <li>• kick a ball forward</li> <li>• feed themselves with a spoon</li> <li>• demand a lot of your attention</li> <li>• turn 2-3 pages at a time</li> <li>• like to imitate their parent</li> <li>• identify hair, eyes, ears and nose by pointing</li> <li>• build a tower of four blocks</li> <li>• show affection</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• throw a ball overhand</li> <li>• ride a tricycle</li> <li>• put on their shoes</li> <li>• open the door</li> <li>• turn one page at a time</li> <li>• play with other children for a few minutes</li> <li>• repeat common rhymes</li> <li>• use three-to-five-word sentences</li> <li>• name at least one color correctly</li> </ul>
